

Highlights of Town Council Meeting – December 11, 2007

Mayor Siddoway reminded the audience that the Town of Star Valley Ranch had an ad in the newspaper looking for a billing clerk/receptionist.

Consent to Sell Star Valley Ranch Association: SVRA Director, Jan Jonson, sent an e-mail to the Mayor stating that were 555 confirmed consent forms have been in out of the 1465 needed.

Street Name Changes: The Town Council approved Resolution 07-12-11-001: Change the name of five streets as read. These streets are in Plat 10 Solitude Circle off Vista West Drive is changed to Wild Rose Circle; Plat 17 North Branch Court off Last Chance Drive is changed to Last Chance Place; Plat 18 Cedar Circle off Porto Road is changed to Jade Circle; Plat 18 Cedar Court off Hardman Road is changed to Paintbrush Court; Plat 20 Elkhorn Circle off Elkhorn Drive is changed to West Elkhorn Circle.

The Town Council approved the Mayor's appointment of Brenda L. Bauer to the position of Town Clerk. The Mayor administered the "Oath of Office Prescribed by the Constitution of Wyoming".

The Town Council approved Resolution 07-12-11-002 to authorize Town Clerk Brenda Bauer access to the Town's funds at the Bank of Star Valley.

The Town Council approved the relocation of Lot Boundary in Plat 6 between Lots 44 and 45 with a 10 foot utility easement on each side of the new lot line as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Board.

Water Workshop: A water workshop was held in order to update the Council on the progress of the water project. Representatives from Weston Engineering and Forsgren Engineering were in attendance along with SVRA Board of Directors, Joe Angelovic, Jan Jonson and Dave Ward.

Roads: Councilman Harker reported that two-thirds of the street signs were installed. This project has been put on hold until the frost is gone in the spring.

Guidelines for parking on roads with snow removal have been posted in the newspaper, the Town's Website and via Town e-mail.

U.S. Postal Service Activities: The committee in charge of this effort has received input, guidance and counsel of a professional USPS advisor. It has been suggested that at this time a Non Personnel Unit (NPU) building be built to house the USPS postal boxes. A flyer was developed and sent to Town Residents to see how many residents would be interested in receiving their mail from a NPU. The information gathered through responses to the flyer will help guide the committee in their decision regarding the NPU.
