

Highlights of Town Council Meeting - June 13, 2006

A letter of resignation had been received from Councilman Larry Lamb with an effective date of June 30, 2006. Councilman Lamb has changed jobs and the new occupation will keep him away from the Ranch for extended periods. With regret the councilmans resignation was accepted and a proclamation of gratitude was read.

Mr Robert McKim of Afton, WY attended the Town Council meeting. Mr McKim has declared his candidacy for the Wyoming House as a representative of the 21st House District, a seat previously held by outgoing Wyoming Speaker of the House Randall Luthi of Freedom, WY.

Seven persons have filed for the office of Town Councilman and one person has filed for Mayor. Their names are include elsewhere in this newsletter.

Angela Aitkin, Town Webmaster announced that although still in the design stages, the Town website is up and running. The website address is www.starvalleyranchwy.org.

The Town is taking applications for personnel to conduct the Special U.S. Census which will commence on the effective date of July 14, 2006. The importance of all elligible residents being counted in this election was reiterated as the Town will receive approximately \$850 per year in shared revenue from the State of Wyoming for each resident.

The emergency road maintenance and dust guard application are complete at a cost to the Town of \$253,169. 4000 tons of pit run gravel, 13,631 tons of road base, 165,000 gallons of dust guard and 495,000 gallons of water were applied to the roads. Potholes in the paved roads are now planned for repair.

Signs with directions to the Town and other information have been installed at eight locations under a cooperatve effort and shared costs between the State, County, Town, Leisure Valley Incorporated, and the Star Valley Ranch Association.

The Town is continuing discussions with the Thayne Rural & Volunteer Fire Dept. and EMS Services for providing these services.

The Town of Star Valley Ranch will form a committee to review school bus issues in the community and will organize information and proposals for School Board Consideration.
