

Highlights of Town Council Meeting – June 12, 2007

The Stonefly Ranch Phase II Subdivision Approval Request: The Town of Star Valley Ranch approved this request. The subdivision is located NW of the NW corner of Plat 3.

Craig Thomas Memorial Flag Designation: The Town of Star Valley Ranch designated the US Flag given to the Town by United State Senator Craig Thomas in 2006, via his sister and Town resident Lynn Martin, be designated as the “Craig Thomas Memorial Flag.”

Assistant to the Mayor: The Town Council approved the motion that the Town of Star Valley Ranch create the position of “Assistant to the Mayor” for the purpose of providing additional administrative expertise in the area of Employee Benefits, Human Resource Package, Employee Policies and Procedures, Public Works Organization and Administration, grant and loan coordination and other Town related projects; as well, to confirm the Mayor’s engagement of Mr. Gregg Wilkes under a professional consulting contract to fill this position.

Municipal Ordinance Officer: The Town of Star Valley Ranch created the position of Municipal Ordinance Officer and authorized the Mayor to appoint individuals to this position.

Ordinances for a Municipal Judge: The Town of Star Valley Ranch approved the first reading of Ordinance 2007-03 – Municipal Judge.

Ordinance: 2007-02: Chapter 4 – Utilities – Culinary Water

The Town of Star Valley Ranch approved the third and final reading of Ordinance 2007-02 for Utilities – Culinary Water, Appendix 4-1 – Water Conservation Plan, and Appendix 4-2 for the Fee Schedule.

Ordinance: 2007-01 Appropriations for Fiscal Year 2007-2008: The Town of Star Valley Ranch approved the third and final reading of Ordinance 2007-01.

Planning: Councilman Redlin stated the contract prepared by Pederson Planning Consultants, selected to develop a Master Plan for the Town, was ready for signature. He also reported that the Planning and Zoning Board had been meeting twice a month developing standards and procedures.

Street Renaming Project: Public Safety Advisor David Ward advised the Council that only five (5) streets needed to be renamed. They are Cedar Circle and Cedar Court. Elkhorn Circle was renamed West Elkhorn Circle and North Branch Court had no homes on it but would need to be renamed. There are 2 streets named Solitude Circle and one would have to be renamed.

Roads: Councilman Harker read the following press release:

“On May 21st, at the beginning of a Joint Star Valley Ranch Association and Town Meeting, Mr. Joe Angelovic, Chairman of the Board of Directors for SVRA presented Mayor Siddoway a signed document representing the final step in the process of declaring all roads within the Town of Star Valley Ranch as “Public Roads.”

The Town now has the authority and the right to install the highly “Reflective Street Name Signs” under a 50:50 grant from the State of Wyoming, State Land and Investments Board for the safety and welfare of the community.

The County Sheriff’s department will be able to issue moving violations with the confidence that the citation not be thrown out of court due to a road classification technicality.

The Town’s future ability to apply for state assistance with major road reconstruct will be increased with no privately designated roads within the Town.
