LIQUOR LICENSE HEARING

March 14, 2006

The **Town of Star Valley Ranch Town Council** held a Liquor License Hearing on March 14, 2006 in the **Star Valley Ranch Association Library**, adjoining **Town Hall**. Other than the Council and the Town Clerk, twelve persons were in attendance.

Mayor Siddoway called the hearing to order at 6:30 p.m., and stated that the purpose of the Town Hearing was to hear from those individuals who have objection(s) to the issuance of a Liquor License in the Town of Star Valley Ranch.

The Town Clerk summarized the application:

The application was a new application for a Liquor License. The applicant was **Mr. Von Nield** (not in attendance) dba **Silo Lounge**, a room described as a 40' x 65' room in the SE corner of a barn at 1800 Cedar Creek Drive, within the town limits of the **Town of Star Valley Ranch, Wyoming**. The term of the license under consideration was to begin March 15, 2006 and end on December 31, 2006, for a pro-rated fee of \$600 (the annual fee being \$750) that was paid when the application was submitted to the Clerk's Office on January 23rd, 2006. The Hearing had been advertised as a Public Notice in the **Star Valley Independent** for four weeks prior, or on February 9, 16, 23, and March 2, 2006 per statutory requirements. The Clerk explained that the application was for a new license, rather than for a renewal, because Mr. Nield had applied for a renewal with the **County of Lincoln** in the Fall of 2005, but was denied after the County took the position that the Silo Lounge would be located within the limits of the newly-incorporated Town of Star Valley Ranch, and would need to apply directly to the Town for a liquor license. The **State of Wyoming's Liquor Division** had registered no objections with the Town regarding this license prior to the hearing.

The Mayor asked those who wished to voice objection(s) to the issuance of the liquor license to be recognized and to state their opinion(s).

There were no objections heard.

The Mayor asked members of the Town Council to voice any objections they may have had to

the issuance of the liquor license.

There were no objections heard.

Hearing no objections, the Mayor stated he would accept a motion to adjourn the hearing.

Councilman Redlin moved that the hearing be adjourned. Councilman Harker seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

The Liquor License Hearing was adjourned at 6:34 p.m.
