Emergency Management is encouraging area residents to take advantage of its **CODE RED** notification system. The system is designed to notify people in the event of an emergency.

The system works through the 911 Emergency program. The limitation is that it only goes out to landlines unless you go in and input your cell phone or email. With this program, messages can be sent out geographically within moments.

The Road Department

The road crew has finished the cul-de-sac projects and started hauling sand and clearing roadways for the winter. The road on Birch and Dogwood has been redeveloped to follow the original Town plated road design. Road base has been placed on Vista West, Alpenglow and Snow Forest. Continued grading of roads will take place along with equipment maintenance to prepare for the winter months. At the conclusion of Water Project 2017 in summer of 2018 all roads involved in the Water Project will be repaired to original condition by the Water Project contractor.



SNOW REMOVAL



We are going into our winter months and would like to remind everyone that is spending the winter here at Star Valley Ranch that road conditions have changed and are becoming more difficult to maneuver and drive on. We hope you have noticed the great condition most of our roads are in and the improvement of roads when compared to those of past years. The Town will continue to make the effort to maintain the roads in the best condition possible.

Please do not inhibit snow removal in any way or any time. Some precautions for the winter months would be:

- Stay out of the way of the snow removal equipment.
- Give the snow removal equipment plenty of room to operate.
- Do not park in the roadway.
- Make certain that your garbage containers are behind your property line.
- Do not push, shovel or blow snow into the road.
- When dropping off children or waiting for the school buses;
 - Please do not park;
 - In the Road
 - Facing the Traffic
 - Near Intersections

PLANNING & ZONING Board

The Planning and Zoning Board members make decisions of major importance to our Community. These decisions can affect the function and appearance of our Community for decades to come while impacting property interests important to individuals of our Community. The Board is all volunteers and they are in need of a few more volunteers who want to have a voice in what our Community will look like in the future.



P & Z October 2017 Report: Year to date the Board has recommended for approval of 12 single family residential homes and other miscellaneous building permits for a total of 36. The Board is currently discussing an application for rezone, health and safety, subdivision ordinance updates and annexation procedures. The Board has had a few inquiries about annexation but no applications.

Mayor's Corner

In 2006, the Town adopted a vision and mission statement. These statements continue to reflect the overall goal of municipal government and its community leaders (Master Plan 2014).

Our vision statement: "A pleasant country setting, where the entire community enjoys the beauty of nature, family and friends, recreation, peace and diversity.

Our mission statement: "Our mission is to make the Town of Star Valley Ranch a great place to live. Our focus will be to enhance our culinary water system, improve our roads, and ensure the public safety for all citizens, property owners, and visitors."



For the past three years the Town has seen a steady decline in revenue from the State of Wyoming therefore we must continue to budget conservatively, keeping in mind what our vision and mission statement tells us our priorities are. In August of 2017 we received our direct distribution from the State which was -21% from the projected numbers that were given to us in March of 2017. Because we are very careful with our budget we should not have to cut out any projects at this time but continue to monitor how we spend our tax dollars.

ANIMAL LICENSE APPLICATION/RENEWAL

Please **READ** and **Follow** these instructions in order to avoid inconvenience and additional costs to you at a later date.

1. All dogs or cats over six-months old shall be licensed within thirty (30) days of taking residence in the Town.
2. Each dog or cat license shall expire on **December 31st** of the calendar year for which it is issued and each dog or cat shall be licensed annually thereafter.
3. Registration fees will be waived for Certified Service Dog or Cat with proof of Certification as prescribed by a Physician or a Certified Trainer.
4. No licensing fee will be prorated for a partial year nor shall a refund be issued for any license fee already paid.
5. License is not transferable. In the event the License is lost or destroyed during the calendar year for which it was issued, a duplicate will be issued at a fee of \$2.
6. The owner's signed confirmation of address and contact information along with the animal's current spayed/neutered (altered) and rabies vaccination receipt from a certified veterinarian shall be required for registration and license renewals.
